GLOBAL ARTICLE 9 CONFERENCE PRACTICAL INFORMATION



4-5 May 2008 Tokyo, Japan

Thank you for your participation in the Global Article 9 Conference to Abolish War!

The participation of citizens from around the world is vital to creating a truly international conference, and in bringing the issue of Article 9 and its principles onto the global stage.

This document contains practical information regarding participation in the Conference, as well as details about how to register.

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1. Access

The conference will be held at Makuhari Messe International Convention Complex (http://www.m-messe.co.jp/index_e.html).

The closest airport to the conference venue is Narita airport, a major international hub with direct flights from many parts of the world.

The nearest train station is "JR Kaihin Makuhari."

As the conference will take place during Golden Week, a period of several Japanese public holidays, we recommend that travel arrangements are made as soon as possible.

From Narita airport: 30 minutes by Highway Bus From Haneda airport: 40 minutes by Highway Bus

From Tokyo station: 30 minutes by train, JR Keiyo Line to JR Kaihin Makuhari (Rapid)

2. Visas

People holding passports from the following countries do not need a visa to enter Japan:

Singapore, Brunei, Hong Kong (BNO, SAR passport), Republic of Korea, Taiwan, Macau (SAR passport), Canada, USA, Mexico, Argentina, Bahamas, Chile, Costa Rica, Dominican Rep., El Salvador, Guatemala, Honduras, Suriname, Uruguay, Barbados, Israel, Turkey, Australia, New Zealand, Lesotho, Mauritius, Tunisia, Austria, Germany, Ireland, Liechtenstein, Switzerland, United Kingdom, Belgium, Croatia, Cyprus, Denmark, Finland, France, Greece, Iceland, Italy, Luxembourg, Macedonia, Malta, Netherlands, Norway, Portugal, San Marino, Slovenia, Spain, Sweden, Andorra, Bulgaria, Poland, Czech Rep., Estonia, Hungary, Latvia, Lithuania, Monaco, Slovakia

4. Tickets

* Children junior high school aged and younger do not require a ticket for entry.

Tickets can be collected upon payment at the designated reception areas at Makuhari Messe on the day. Payment will be accepted in Japanese yen or US dollars cash only – sorry, no credit card facilities are available. For participants who have pre-registered, the tickets are available at the pre-sales price; further tickets will also be available on the day.

Hostels

While there are no youth hostels directly in the area, the venue is only 30 minutes by train from Tokyo station, making budget accommodation in the central Tokyo area a suitable lower cost alternative.

Host Families

Homestays may be available on a very limited basis. Please contact the secretariat if you are interested in staying with a host family in Chiba.

If available, spaces will be allotted with priority to youths, participants from the global south, and others who demonstrate the greatest level of economic need.

6. Food

There are several restaurants at Makuhari Messe, with meals available for approximately 1000 yen. Convenience stores and snack bars are also located within the venue.

There are also numerous restaurants and shopping centres within the vicinity, catering to a range of budgets.

7. Special Assistance

Interpretation

Japanese is the official language for the conference, however interpretation will be available in English for all major sessions, including the plenary and all Organising Committee sponsored symposiums.

English assistance and guidance will also be available throughout the venue.

Efforts will be made to accommodate other languages as well. If you require assistance or can provide interpretation in other languages (on a more informal basis), please let us know.

Disabilities

Makuhari Messe is fully wheelchair accessible. If you have other special needs, please let us know on the registration form and we will do our best to meet them. Please note that not all hotels in the area are wheelchair accessible.

8. Venue

Makuhari Messe International Convention Complex: http://www.m-messe.co.jp/index_e.html

Makuhari Messe integrates the International Exhibition Hall, International Conference Hall, and the Makuhari Event Hall over 210,000 square meters of land to form one of the most well-known convention facilities in Japan. It is located between central Tokyo and Narita International Airport, in Chiba prefecture.

Facilities include several restaurants and cafeterias, sightseeing information, a business centre with internet facilities, fax and copy service, coin-operated lockers, ATM (Chiba Bank – cannot use cards issued outside of Japan) and massage corner.

Nearby there are several shopping centres, cinema complexes, the vast Makuhari Seaside Park and more.

Visits to significant sites in Tokyo such as the controversial Yasukuni Shrine and the *Daigo Fukuryumaru* (Fifth Lucky Dragon) Exhibition Hall may be offered on 3 May – if you are interested in participating, please indicate this on your registration form.

9. Foreign Exchange

The currency of Japan is the Japanese Yen (JPY). 100 JPY is roughly equivalent to 1 USD or 65 Euro cents. Please consult your local bank or see the following website for exchange rates for other currencies: www.xe.com Withdrawals from international VISA cards can be made at all post offices throughout Japan.

Facilities accepting non-Japanese ATM and credit cards can be difficult to find in Japan, and are not available at the conference venue. We recommend exchanging currency in your own country, or using the international ATMs upon arrival at Narita Airport.

10. Volunteering
